
Institute has chosen **option A**.

Parameter 7: Curriculum inculcates pharmaceutical ethics and life-long learning?

Action Taken: Alumni (100%) agreed with curriculum that inculcates pharmaceutical ethics and life- long learning. While designing and conducting extension activities (co-and extracurricular) institute tries to fulfill PO11, that is life-long learning.



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Action Taken Report on Employers Feedback (Academic Performance)

Based on the report of analysis, following actions have been taken by the institution:

Parameter 1: Did the institute provide student centric teaching learning process?

Action taken: The employers marked 'Yes' (100%) to the parameter related to student centric teaching learning process, which clearly indicates that institute takes special efforts to pedagogics.

Parameter 2: Did the institute take special efforts to strengthen soft skills?

M. Pharm Sem I and Sem II

'content beyond syllabus'.

2: Recent advances in course are covered/Not

Action Taken: Semester I, II, III and IV courses such as HAP I & II, POC I, Biochemistry, pathophysiology, physical pharmaceutics, instrumental methods of analysis which are basic and core subjects did not have recent advances. However, teachers provided extra information considering the recent advancements in these courses.

3: Applicability/relevance to real life situations

Action Taken: Teachers of B. Pharm semester I, III, V, VII and M. Pharm semester-I marked Very Good and Good because some core courses such as pharmaceutical analysis, pharmaceutical organic chemistry, medicinal chemistry, instrumental method of analysis were

not related to real life situations.

4: Does the course instills creativity

Action Taken: Institute follows the curriculum designed by SPPU, wherein, institute does not have authority to make changes. 5: Does the course address about human/social values, professional ethics
