The Constitution Day (SamvidhanDiwas) was celebrated as a mark of tribute to Dr. Bhimrao Ambedkar, the first law minister of India, who played an important role in the framing of the Indian Constitution. Dr. Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar, became the first law minister of India in the Congress-led Centre, was appointed as the chairman of the constitution drafting committee in 1947 and was given the responsibility of writing the country's new constitution. The original copy of the Indian Constitution is 251 pages long- it is the most detailed in the world. It contains 395 Articles, 22 Parts and 12 Schedules. It has undergone 103 amendments till date. Prof. Sandhya Jain delivered lecture on Indian Constitution. Anushka Shinde and Aishwarya Patil from Final Year B. Pharm. shared their thoughts on Indian constitution.
